Our Commitment

Vista America is dedicated to continuously enhancing its systems and processes to prevent all forms of modern slavery and human trafficking across our operations and supply chains. We uphold the highest standards of integrity and transparency, maintaining a zero-tolerance stance on forced labor and exploitation. We ensure strict compliance with our policy commitments as well as all relevant government legislation and regulations.

Our Supply Chain

Vista America's supply chains are around the globe and include, but are not limited to, aircraft and aircraft component manufacturers, lessors, ground handling services, fuel suppliers, and maintenance providers. We perform due diligence on all suppliers before engaging their services, which includes verifying regulatory licenses and certifications, assessing compliance with relevant authorities, evaluating financial stability, and conducting audits where necessary.

Policies and Procedure

We have established a range of policies to help prevent modern slavery, including an Anti-Slavery and Human Trafficking Policy, a Supplier Code of Conduct that sets out labor standards and compliance expectations, a Speak Up Procedure that allows staff to report concerns confidentially, and robust due diligence procedures for supplier onboarding.



Training and Awareness

All employees receive training on identifying signs of modern slavery and reporting procedures. Awareness campaigns and internal communications further reinforce our commitment.

This statement is made pursuant to the trafficking Victims Protection Act (TVPA) of 2000 which outlines the steps Vista America has taken to prevent modern slavery and human trafficking in our business operations and supply chains.
